Table /'teɪ.bəl/ — noun → a place where you sit to eat.

Restaurant /'res.tər.ɒnt/ — noun → a place where people go to eat.

Water /'wɔː.tər/ — noun → a drink with no color or taste.

Salad /'sæl.əd/ — noun → a dish with vegetables.

Ready /'red.i/ — adjective → prepared to do something.

Choose /tʃuːz/ — verb → to pick something you like.

Practice /'præk.tɪs/ — noun → doing something again to improve.

Useful English Phrases

A table for two, please. → use this to ask for a table for two people.

May I see the menu? → ask to get the list of food.

I am ready for ordering. → say this when you want to order.

I would like... → a polite way to ask for food.

A glass of water, please. → ask for a drink.

Anything else? → used by the waiter to ask if you want more.

That is all. → say this when you don't want more items.

Follow me, please. → used when someone shows you your table.

Do you need more time? → asking if the person is ready.

Thank you very much. → polite way to say thanks.
