Podcast Transcript – Talking About Family

Mike: Hello and welcome to the Easy English Podcast Show! I am Mike.

Anna: And I am Anna! Hi everyone! We are so happy you are listening to this podcast today.

Mike: Today is a very special topic. We are talking about family in English. Family is so important to all of us.

Anna: Yes! By the end of this podcast episode, you will be able to describe your family in English clearly. You will learn the words for the people you love.

Anna: You are doing a great job already. Let's learn some English family words for beginners!

Natural Dialogue – Introducing Family Members

Mike: Anna, I have a new photo on my phone. Do you want to see my family?

Anna: Oh, yes! I love photos. Who are the people in this picture?

Mike: These are my parents. This is my mother, Maria, and this is my father, John.

Anna: They look very kind! Are they living in London?

Mike: No, they live in a small house near the sea. And look at this—this is my brother and his wife.

Anna: Oh! Is your brother married?

Mike: Yes, he is married to Elena. They are very happy. They have two children.

Anna: Two children? Is it a son and a daughter?

Mike: Exactly! Their son is five years old, and their daughter is only two. They are very cute!

Anna: That is a beautiful family, Mike. What about you? Are you married?

Mike: No, I am not married. I live with my cat! But I love visiting my parents and my brother's kids.

Anna: That sounds lovely. It is so nice to have a big, happy family.

Key Vocabulary – Parents, Children, Husband, Wife

Mike: That was a very simple English family vocabulary conversation. Let's look at some important words.

Anna: Yes! Let's start with parents. Remember, your parents are your mother and your father together.

Mike: Parents. Try to say it: parents.

Anna: Now, let's talk about being married. If a man is married, he has a wife. If a woman is married, she has a husband.

Mike: Wife and husband. These are common family members in English. Repeat after me: husband. And... wife.

Anna: And what about the kids? We call them children. A boy is a son, and a girl is a daughter.

Mike: Repeat these with me: son. And... daughter.

Anna: You are doing so well. It is okay if these words are new to you. You don't need to remember everything today.

Mike: That's right. Just by listening to this English conversation about family, you are making progress.

Anna: Every word you learn makes you stronger. We are very proud of you!

Everyday Examples – Talking About Family in Life

Mike: Now, let's see how we use these words in real life. Imagine you are at a cafe with a new friend. You want to show them your life!

Anna: That is a great example, Mike! You open your wallet and show a picture. You say: "This is my wife, Sarah. We are very happy together."

Mike: And if you are a woman, you say: "This is my husband, David. He is a teacher." It is so simple and so nice to share.

Anna: Or imagine you are shopping for clothes. You see a small shirt and say: "This is for my son." Or a beautiful dress and say: "This is for my daughter."

Mike: Yes! And the shop worker might ask: "How many children do you have?" You can answer: "I have two children."

Anna: I love talking about parents too. When I visit my house, I say: "I am going to see my mother and father." It makes me feel warm inside.

Mike: Me too. Even a simple sentence like "My parents are great" says so much. These family members in English are part of our hearts.

Anna: Exactly! Using these simple English family vocabulary words helps you connect with people. It's not just about words; it's about your life!

Mike: That's right. Whether you are married or single, talking about your family is a beautiful way to practice English.

Mini Speaking Practice – Repeat Family Phrases

Anna: Now, it is your turn! This is your English speaking practice family time. Are you ready? Don't be shy—speak out loud with us!

Mike: I will say a phrase, and then there will be a pause. Repeat after me. Let's start! "This is my family."

Anna: Now, let's talk about our parents. Repeat: "I love my mother and father."

Mike: Now, let's try this one: "I am married."

Anna: Now, let's talk about a husband or a wife. Repeat: "My husband is kind." Or: "My wife is happy."

Mike: Perfect. Now, let's practice the words for kids. Repeat: "My son is a student." And: "My daughter is small."

Mike: Look at you! You are using English family A1 A2 phrases like a pro. How does it feel?

Parents /'peərənts/ — noun → your mother and father together.

Mother /'mʌðər/ — noun → a female parent.

Father /'fɑːðər/ — noun → a male parent.

Brother /'brʌðər/ — noun → a male sibling.

Sister /'sɪstər/ — noun → a female sibling.

Husband /'hʌzbənd/ — noun → a man who is married.

Wife /waɪf/ — noun → a woman who is married.

Son /sʌn/ — noun → a male child.

Daughter /'dɔːtər/ — noun → a female child.

Family /'fæməli/ — noun → a group of people who are related.

Useful English Phrases

This is my family — use this phrase to show all the people in your family.
I love my mother and father — say this to show your love for your parents.
I am married — say this to tell someone that you have a husband or wife.
My husband is kind — use this to describe your husband.
My wife is happy — use this to describe your wife.
My son is a student — say this to talk about your son.
My daughter is small — say this to talk about your daughter.
I have two children — use this to say how many children you have.
My parents are great — use this to describe your parents.
Are they married? — ask this question to find out if someone is married.
